5. Healthy Community Collaborative Recap

06/2023 - HCC hosted our first coalition meeting as "Healthy Community Collaborative"

09/2023 - During HCC's Quarterly Coalition Meeting, HCC Coalition Members named health disparities that they had "seen or experienced in the Harrisonburg-Rockingham area. Through all disparities named, the majority of disparities were identified in 3 main categories: Stigma/ Prejudice, Barriers to Access, and Health

Literacy & Resource Navigation

01/2024 - During HCC's Quarterly Coalition Meeting, HCC Coalition Members brainstormed resourced that were already existing, did not exist, and could exist in the H-R area related to the 3 categories of Health Disparities identified in the 09/2023 Coalition Meeting

03/2024 - HCC's Steering Committee met 2x to review the info gathered from the 01/2024 HCC Coalition Meeting to determine relevant and feasible project ideas, resulting in 6 project ideas.

04/2024 - During HCC's Quarterly Coalition Meeting, HCC Coalition Members drafted ideas for each of the 6 projects, presented the drafted project ideas, and then voted on the project ideas. Coalition Members casted votes based on the following prompts: "Which project should HCC focus on first?", "Which project is the most important?", "Which project would you be willing to help with?"

04/2024 (cont.) - The projects that received the most votes, based on the above 3 categories were #1 "Life Skills and Health Literacy Workshops" and #2"Community Connection Events"

07/2024 - HCC formed the "Workshop Project Team" as a dedicated to develop HCC's projects related to "Life Skills and Health Literacy"

07/2024 - During HCC's Quarterly Coalition Meeting, Coalition Members brainstormed "Life Skills and Health Literacy Workshop" topic ideas and voted on which topics HCC's Workshop Project Team would focus on. The results of the voting were: #1 Long Term Planning Education, #2 Speed Dating for Case Managers, and #3 Financial Education
